

The School LAND Trust Program

The School LAND Trust program brings tens of millions of dollars annually to academic programs in public schools across Utah. The funds are generated from school trust lands. Charter Schools have Trust Lands Councils that carefully review student assessments and progress to decide which academic areas they want to focus on. Plans are developed to improve student academic performance in the identified academic areas with the annual School LAND Trust funds. The plans are approved by the council, submitted on this website, and approved by the Utah State Board of Education.

School Land Trust Report for 2018-2019 for Bear River Charter

Our Goal: Hire teacher aides for the 2018-2019 school year. Aides will spend at least 80% of their time interacting with, instructing, or preparing to instruct a student or students in a core subject area such as math or language arts for remediation or enrichment.

Implementation: Funds were used to hire classroom aides. Teachers have time built into their schedule for skill groups. Skill groups take place four days a week for 30 minutes each day. This is a time that students receive support on academic skills or social emotional skills. Teachers and aides also have common preparation time for collaboration. After school training for teachers and aides was held quarterly during the school year. Teachers generate a monthly report on instruction during skill time. The report is reviewed by the School Support Team to determine effectiveness and/or to plan needed support.
